What listeners said about the experience:

- "There is passion and love and hope in the people in our congregation, and a desire ... to cross any divides we may perceive so that we can work better together in common cause."
- "I love learning things about church members that I've never learned before."
- "I found out things I would never have known about some of the people I interviewed [and] I got to share with them... [N]ow when we see each other we do so with more understanding and knowledge of each other."
- "After nine one on ones, I'm convinced this should be part of my ongoing spiritual practice."

13 Members conducted 1-on-1 conversations (July - September)

78 Conversations took place

What did we do with the information?

- Gathered pertinent but not personal information - to help facilitate connections
- Adding information such as interests and occupation to our membership database (if we didn't already have it)
- Reported our findings to Community Renewal Society along with other churches
